8. GO TO THE BACK OF THE HALL BEHIND THE STAIRCASE

Remember the animal you saw on the front door. How many can you see on each of the wooden chairs?

9. GO TO THE KITCHEN WING. THE FIRST DOOR ON THE LEFT IS THE BUTLER'S PANTRY

The small room in the corner is the silver safe. What is the door made of – wood, plastic or steel?

10. GO TO THE SCULLERY

What were the holes in the ceiling for? (HINT: The lights were gas lights)

11. GO TO THE BILLIARD ROOM. The table is being used for a snooker game.

How many balls do you need to play snooker? (1 is missing)

Can you see where the falcons are in this room?
